With the 2011 Tsunami as a backdrop, the film is a staggering odyssey, an essay on grief, on how humans and nature rebuild after trauma. Via rarely seen places below the sea to one of the Hawaiian islands where volunteers gather to clean a beach from Japanese tsunami debris, the documentary moves from the shores of Japan where Sachiko, Yasu and Satoko try to find ways to accept their loss.

J.C. ABBEY, GHANA'S PUPPETEER

(Ghana, 2016, 55')

Directed by: Steven Feld, Anyaa Arts Kollektif

This film documents a fifty-year artistic career, from Accra's streets to Ghana's villages to international TV. In fifteen puppet shows, Mr. Abbey, joined by musicians and filmmakers, chronicles Ghana's music since its independence in 1957. The marionettes perform ethnic songs, dances and stories, but equally the sounds of highlife, Afro-jazz, Afro-rock, reggae, and contemporary hiplife. The soundtrack includes historical documents from radio, TV and broadcast, and LP, as well as new compositions commissioned and performed to playback.

THE SOUND OF BELLS / O SOM DOS SINOS

(Brazil, 2016, **52'**)

Directed by: Marcia Mansur, Marina Thomé

In Minas Gerais, Brazil, bell sounds set the pace of life announcing the time for work, rest, prayer and celebration. Over 40 different bell rings are nominated as part of the Brazilian Intangible Cultural Heritage. The bell ringers have transformed the bell rings over the centuries and have mixed their colonial origins with the strong African heritage in Brazil. The documentary is a poetic representation of the religious everyday experience.

This story explores the mid-century archival films by the German musician Margot Dias who documented life in the extreme north of Mozambique Africa, then a Portuguese colony. The films are an unprecedented visual and sound record of the Makonde culture. The filmmaker brings these films and photographs back to the community. Contemporary musicians, artists and a new generation reflect upon these images and this period of colonial history.

DOMY + AILUCHA: CENAS KETS!

(Portugal, France, 2022, **30'**) Directed by: Ico Costa

In 2020, unable to travel to Mozambique, Ico Costa asked Ailucha and Domingos to film their daily lives with a camera he had left in Inhambane the previous year. The camera acquired a special presence in the group, recording the teenage life, the working, the playing, the hanging around, the singing and dancing, the desire.

ANALOGUE PRACTICES IN DIGITAL LANDSCAPES

(Austria, 2023, **39'**) Directed by: Işıl Karataş

In an era defined by the rapid advancement of digital technologies, this film captures the daily lives of artists, retailers and repairers who intimately engage with obsolete or discarded technologies. This experimental ethnographic film creatively explores audiovisual cultural research methods, portraying analogue film communities in Berlin and Vienna and mechanical repair shops in Istanbul.

THE WORLD SAVED BY GIRLS

A surreal immersion into the lives and imagination of five girls from Sardinia. The girls want to save the world, but we don't know if they'll be successful. We only know they have superpowers, something to say, and unpredictable desires. Adolescence is always a struggle, and imagination is always revolutionary.

ONE OF US NOW

(Germany / Israel, 2002, **30'**) Directed by: Maya Steinberg

Maya Steinberg is a secular Israeli. Her father, however, had a late religious awakening. He will not appear in her film. Instead, the young director approaches his faith and her lack of understanding for it through a visit to the gravesite of rabbi Shimon bar Yochai in Galilee, where she spends a few weeks, observing believers, Orthodox and ultra-Orthodox, and wondering: Is there a place here for women? And can there be a place for queer women?

ESTHER

(Switzerland, 2021, **19'**) Directed by: Ana Scheu Amigo

Esther grew up on a remote farm in the mountains. Since her move to the city, many things have fundamentally changed for her. The place of her childhood, however, has remained the same. How can she stand by her values without distancing herself from her parents? A story about growing up, where feminism collides with Catholicism.

BALTIC (SO IT IS!)

(United Kingdom, 2023, **6'**) Directed by: Stella Skiadopoulou

A group of sprightly middle-aged women take up cold water swimming on the Northern Irish coast. With squealing laughs in the freezing water and hot cups of tea sprinkled with sand, they leave behind sorrows, form friendships, and redefine the idea of longevity.

LIKE APHRODITE

(Albania, 2023, **23'**) Directed by:Anisa Xhomagi

A second generation Albanian migrant in Greece, Anisa, follows her mother, Aphrodite, from her cleaning job to a trip with other Albanian women. A tender view of a generation of migrants usually seen as precarious workers, the film focuses on leisure, as a way to connect, to resist and organise against work exploitation and racism.

A lift operator in a hospital wants to travel into space, a farmer in search of a perfect wife and the young feminist girls who simply want to live their lives.

(Netherlands, England, 2021, **32'**)
Directed by: Geerte Cornelia Catharina Rietveld

Trucks, ships, planes and trains pass by on a daily basis. Families live and grow up on ships, live according to another rhythm than the rest of society. The physical visibility versus social invisibility of transportation jobs stands central to the film. This portrait-based film proposes the base for the concept of the "transport nomad". A nomad found right in the middle of western capitalism yet clashes with the society's expectation of sedentary living.

ENTANGLEMENTS: OBSERVATIONS ON BEACH RELATIONS

(Netherlands, Spain, 2022, **23'**) Directed by: Lena Drukker

'Entanglements' explores the relationships between mass tourism and a beach. In the Spanish beach town Calella de Palafrugell, emerging tourism changed the landscape and human experiences of nature. The film is a collection of observations of the beach as a place of leisure and visitors' engagement with their surroundings.

MULTI-LOVE: A COLLECTION OF NON-MONOGAMOUS TALES

(Netherlands, 2022, **33'**) Directed by: Mowgli Legein

Multi-love is a short reflective documentary centred around "consensual non-monogamy" and the various forms of romance, relationality, and sexuality it entails. Made as part of an anthropological research project, it portrays the overlapping and contrasting tales of multiple people, including the filmmaker herself, through interviews and drawings.

At the ripe age of 90, Alexandru gardens, jokes and repairs watches in the workshop opened by his father in 1909, somewhere in southern Romania. Noone sees that his past as a political prisoner has changed his life forever. The film is an ode to resilience and attempts to record the fragmented memory of one of the last direct witnesses of the Romanian forced labour camps and political prisons.

The film is an immersion into the rich ecosystem of Sable Island, guided by naturalist and environmentalist Zoe Lucas who has lived there over 40 years. Shot on 16mm and created using a scope of innovative eco-friendly filmmaking techniques, this experimental documentary is a playful and reverent collaboration with the natural world. Zoe leads us among wild horses, seals and bugs, through peaks, valleys, roots, sands, weathers, seasons and stars.

THE SACRED BAGPIPE

(Greece, 2000, **12'**)
Directed by: Miranda Terzopoulou, Sotiris Anastasiades

In 1997, as part of an interdisciplinary research conducted by the "Friends of Music Association for the music of Thrace", researchers, musicians and sighs from Greece visited Chernopolie, Crimea. They recorded a ceremony of "anastenaria" performed by Thracian refugees of Eastern Romulia who settled there probably around the first half of the 19th century. The last bagpiper of the community had died several years ago and no one succeeded him. The bagpipe as a sacred object hung, now "speechless", next to the icons of Saint Constantine and Saint Helen. Listening to this new presence and music by a member of the group, causes intense emotion of ecstasy, since music is one of the main components of these festivals. This film is a unique ethnographic treasure.

FIRES AFTER ME. AMANES SONG IN NORTHERN AEGEAN

(Greece, 2015, **81'**)

Directed by: Dimitris Papageorgiou, Alexandros Spathis

A film about Amanes (a traditional, improvisational music form with references to the ottoman musical culture) in the North Aegean, including interviews and recordings conducted at Lesvos, Lemnos, Chios, Samos and Ikaria. An experimental documentary placing emphasis on self-reflection through the research and the research experience while also adopting a critical perspective with regard to the research "content" itself.

THE VILLAGE

(Ireland, 1968, **70'**) Directed by: Mark McCarty

An intimate study of the slow-paced diurnal round of activity in Dunquin, County Kerry, Ireland, the western-most village in Europe and one of the last Gaelic-speaking communities. At the time of filming, 1967, the village consisted of 180 people, most elderly and poor. This portrait of a peasant society was filmed at a time when acculturation by urban tourists was beginning; the language, customs and subsistence techniques of the past are presented without commentary or narration. A hidden treasure that presages the coming of observational cinema where the great film scholar Colin Young and the anthropologist Paul Hockings collaborate under the direction of Mark McCarty.

The story talks about the violence that trans women experience in Mexico, the country with the second most hate crimes due to transphobia in the world. The film brings us closer to a world full of darkness which is filled with light through the actions of the protagonist, her conviction to fight, and her humanity.

The film portrays a forensics of memory in a digital landscape. Based on three months of fieldwork and digital research, the filmmaker connects her personal experiences of loss with her explorations of a fire affected landscape, where people live and work with the consequences of disaster and climate change.

On the coast of the Arctic Ocean of Chukotka live a people cut off from the world. Their life revolves around hunting walruses and whales and protecting villages from bears coming from the tundra. The film is a reflection on death.

RASPUTIN'S SHADOW / L'OMBRA DI RASPUTIN

* Trigger Warning: Animal Cruelty

(Italy, 2022, **27'**)

Directed by: Pietro Francesco Pingitore

A hunter, a veterinarian and a nurse converse around a surgical table while performing surgery on a wild boar. Different visions of care juxtapose in an ecology where nature is manufactured and exploited by human capital. This sensorial exploration looks at conservation behaviours as infrastructures shielding domestic spheres from wildlife in the plains surrounding Piacenza. Landscapes are framed in conversations with humans, other-than-human actants and technologies of control.
